AI skills remain in high demand

Employers continue to seek professionals with AI, data, and digital skills across multiple industries.

Protect Your Eyes

It is important to pay attention to our eye health as tech workers. We often spend several hours on screens, such as computers, laptops and phones.

Below are a few tips to protect our eyes:

- **20-20-20 rule:** every 20 minutes, look 20 feet away for 20 seconds.
- **Blue-light management:** not because of eye damage, but because it improves sleep quality. Use night mode on screens after sunset.
- **Blink intentionally:** screen work reduces blink rate by ~60%, causing dryness. Try "blink sets" (10 slow blinks).
